- Minutes from June 21, 2011 were approved.

Business & Site Update

- Cogen Plant
 - The project is on the way – the old cogen is being removed piece by piece for salvage. The new equipment must be here on site by April 2012. New CoGen will allow for a much more energy efficient operation.
- Building 213 Demo Project
 - Project is finished without no environmental or safety incidents. All equipment is removed and the project is closed.
 - Rik Atkinson commented on the demo team for an applauding demo project. He understands from working here how dangerous some of the material is in the building. When equipment was closed and shutdown in 2005, the employees took it to heart and removed/cleared everything properly. Demo was very successful.
- Solar Panels
 - Planning board meeting was postponed. The solar panel company needed to notify all parties to ensure intent and must receive confirmation of their notice.
- Building 200 Warehouse
 - The first project for the warehouse, now DSM is the roof replacement. This will be a huge and long project - 5 acres under the roof.

Old Business

- Linda Griest provided the group with an update from the First Night Out Community Event. On August 1st Safe Kids Organization along with DSM sponsored bike helmets to local children. The bike helmets and safety pamphlets were distributed. Linda Stettler presented an award to Linda Griest thanking her for her efforts and for DSM's support. The recognition award was for an outstanding outreach to keep our local children safe.

Safety Reports

- NJDEP Title V Air Permit Significant Modification approved. This removed Vit C hazardous air pollutant (HAP's) emissions and USEPA MACT applicability
- NJDEP Title V Air Permit Minor Modification to make changes to B209 and B262 dust collectors was also approved.
- Transferred air emission CER's from RVI to DSM.
- Delaware Sludge Farm closure was questioned under ISRA but DEP now agrees no actions required. This allows the Solar Project to proceed.
- Annual USEPA Greenhouse Gas Reporting, due 30-Sept (new).
- Incidents
 - 6-Sept-2011 – Lost 22,000 gallons of dextrose from leaking manway on tank T110.
 - 15-Sept-2011 – Contractor electrician tripped and broke his arm while working on Cogen demo project
 - 19-Sept-2011 – Lab technician burned 2 fingers on hot ceramic crucible
- Linda Griest provided handout from the Food/Drug Administration – food safety and science; teaching your kids at home.

New Business

- Ernie Maso introduced Linda Stettler. Linda will replace Marianne Meyer-Garcia representing the Belvidere Town Council.

Agenda Items for Next Meeting:

- Presentation of new CoGen – tour site when complete
- Frequency of meetings/format – to be discussed at December meeting.
